RULES & REGULATIONS

1. No entry fee is required for bench exhibits.
2. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
3. Exhibits may not be entered more than once in this Fair.
4. All bench exhibits must be entered from: 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Thursday, August 7th and 8:00 am to 12:00 pm on Friday, August 8th
5. Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to whatever they have on exhibit. They will do the same at the close of the Fair. The Fair Board will endeavor to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
6. No more than one prize will be awarded to any one exhibitor in any one class for bench exhibits.
7. Where the total number of exhibitors in any one class is less than three, the Committee shall be at liberty to amalgamate such events with others of like character.
8. Where the judge is of the opinion that an exhibit does not justify an award, ribbons may be awarded according to standing.
9. The Board reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules.
10. Exhibits may be removed from the Bench Show after 4:00 pm on Saturday, August 9th.
11. Exhibits must conform to the description of the class.
12. Unless otherwise specified, prizes will be ribbons. Awards are based on points as follows: 5 points for First Place, 3 points for Second Place, 1 point for Third Place.
13. Coronation Fair Board will not be responsible for any accidents or injuries in the rinks or Fair Grounds.
